

Notes on Veterinary Acupuncture Remedy Trays

The history of veterinary acupuncture can be traced back several thousand years as it developed alongside human acupuncture in traditional Chinese medicine. The earliest known text is "Bai-le Zhen Jing" (Canon of Veterinary Acupuncture) by Sun-Yang, a Chinese military general. Sun-Yang was a legendary practitioner, noted for his great skill treating animals especially horses. Equine acupuncture has been more extensively developed and practiced than any other animal systems of acupuncture because of their heavy use and invaluable service that horses have provided in warfare, transportation and in farming. Even to this day in modern veterinary practice, equine acupuncture continues to be the most sophisticated and researched because of the commercial value of race-horses and the need for optimal performance and recovery from injuries required by the nature of the sport. (This is analogous to the development of sports medicine for human athletes.)

Currently, the standard of veterinary acupuncture in the West is maintained by the International Veterinary Acupuncture Society (IVAS) which was formed in 1974. The acupuncture information contained in these Remedy Trays are based on traditional Chinese veterinary medicine, IVAS standards, and the practices of modern veterinary acupuncturists.*

Following are the descriptions of each of the individual trays:

Avian Acupuncture: Traditional Chinese acupuncture atlas for birds.

Avian Conditions: Traditional acupuncture point selections for various conditions of birds.

Cattle Acupuncture.Ear: Traditional Chinese acupuncture system which maps the whole body of the cattle onto the ear and addresses different conditions by treating the corresponding area.

Cattle Acupuncture Yang Points: Traditional Chinese yang acupuncture points for cattle.

Cattle Acupuncture Yin Points: Traditional Chinese yin acupuncture points for cattle.

Cattle Conditions: Traditional Chinese acupuncture point selections for common ailments for cattle.

Chinese Herbal Formulas: Chinese herbal formulas which can be applied to all the different animals for informational and energetic balancing. These should not be given to the animal for ingestion without consulting a licensed veterinarian who is trained in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Chinese Herbs: Single Chinese herbs which can be applied to all the different animals for informational and energetic balancing. These should not be given to the animal for ingestion without consulting a licensed veterinarian who is trained in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Chinese Herbs. Min Shan: Brand of Chinese herbal patent remedies which can be applied to all the different animals for informational and energetic balancing. These should not be given to the animal for ingestion without consulting a licensed veterinarian who is trained in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Chinese Herbs. Plum Flower: Brand of Chinese herbal remedies which can be applied to all the different animals for informational and energetic balancing. These should not be given to the animal for ingestion without consulting a licensed veterinarian who is trained in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Equine Acupuncture. Coronary Band: An ECIWO (Embryo Containing Information for the Whole Organism) system, developed by Dr. Are S. Thoreson. Thoreson Coronary band Therapy (TCT) is a microsystem of acupuncture with reflex points on the coronary bands of the four hooves of the horse which relate to the entire anatomy.

Equine Acupuncture. Korean: Traditional Korean system of acupuncture developed for horses.

Equine Acupuncture. Ting-Points: A diagnostic and therapeutic equine acupuncture method developed by Dr. Are S. Thoreson based on points located on the hooves.

Equine Acupuncture. Traditional: The traditional Chinese acupuncture points used specifically on horses by veterinarians since ancient times.

Equine Acupuncture. Transpositional: The human meridian system mapped onto the anatomy of a horse (e.g. the forelegs are equivalent to our arms). This is a different atlas than the one in the Equine Acupuncture. Traditional Remedy Tray.

Equine Conditions: Acupuncture point selections for various equine conditions.

Equine Conditions. Biomechanics: Conditions which affect the performance of a horse. These remedies would be especially useful for race horses.

Equine Conditions. Digestive: Acupuncture point selections for common ailments of the equine gastrointestinal tract.

Equine Conditions. Musculoskeletal: Acupuncture point selections for common musculoskeletal conditions.

Equine Therapy. Hanna Somatics: A somatic educational training and therapy for horses developed by Dr. Hanna which gently retrains in the proper biomechanics of movement.

Porcine Acupuncture: Traditional Chinese acupuncture atlas for the pig.

Porcine Conditions: Traditional acupuncture point selections for various ailments of pigs.

Veterinary Acupuncture: Traditional Chinese acupuncture atlas for small animals e.g. dogs, cats and rabbits.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Ear: Traditional Chinese acupuncture system which maps the whole body onto the ear and addresses different conditions by treating the corresponding area.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Extra Points: Acupuncture points which do not lie on the meridians but have been found useful for treatment.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Homeopathy: System of homeopathic remedies which balances the meridians.

Veterinary Acupuncture.LMS: The Longitudinal Muscle-channel System is a acupuncture system which combined with the Eight Principles or Five Element Theory is used to treat canine lameness.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Meridians: The major acupuncture meridians used in Traditional Chinese Medicine for small animals.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Scalp: Traditional Chinese acupuncture system which maps the whole body onto the scalp and addresses different conditions by treating the corresponding area.

Veterinary Acupuncture. Special Pts: Categories of acupuncture points based on their function in the meridian and in the whole meridian system.

Veterinary Acupuncture.TCM: Traditional Chinese Medicine treatment principles based on the Eight Principles and Zang Fu Organ System.

Veterinary Acupuncture. Techniques: Different methods (e.g. stapling or gold bead implantation) of stimulating the acupuncture points other than the traditional needling techniques used for people.

Veterinary Acupuncture.Trigger Point: Acupuncture points which correspond to trigger points for various muscles used in Trigger Point Therapy.

Veterinary Conditions.Analgesia: Acupuncture point selections used for analgesia for various painful conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Behavioral: Acupuncture point selections used to help treat behavioral problems e.g. inappropriate urination of a pet dog or cat.

Veterinary Conditions.Circulatory: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various cardiovascular conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Critical Care: Acupuncture point selections used in various emergency conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Dental & Ear: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the teeth and ears.

Veterinary Conditions.Dermatologic: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various skin conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Digestive: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the gastrointestinal tract.

Veterinary Conditions.Endocrine: Acupuncture point selections used to help treat various imbalances of the endocrine glands.

Veterinary Conditions.Hematology: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions concerning the blood.

Veterinary Conditions.Immune: Acupuncture point selections used to help treat various imbalances of the immune system.

Veterinary Conditions.Musculoskeletal: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various musculoskeletal conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Neoplastic: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various neoplastic conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Neurologic: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the nervous system.

Veterinary Conditions.Ophthalmologic: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the eyes.

Veterinary Conditions.Reproductive: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the reproductive system. These were traditionally used by breeders to promote fertility and healthy births.

Veterinary Conditions.Respiratory: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various respiratory conditions.

Veterinary Conditions.Urologic: Acupuncture point selections used to balance various conditions of the urogenital tract.

Veterinary Healing.Emotional: Different emotions which the animal may be affecting the animal such as fear and anger.

Veterinary Healing.Manipulative: Various forms of bodywork such as osteopathy, myofascial release and craniosacral therapy.

Veterinary Healing.Spiritual: Spiritual beings who can be called upon for divine assistance such as St. Francis (patron saint for animals) and Krishna.

Veterinary Healing.Subtle Anatomy: Different levels and system of our subtle anatomy including the chakras, subtle bodies and marmas.

Veterinary Remedies.Alaskan Flower - - Pegasus: Flower, gem, star and environmental essences which help address the emotional and psychological aspects of the animals and their conditions.

Veterinary Treatment – Select: Helps select which of the above Veterinary Remedy Trays would be most useful for animal being treated for the condition being analyzed.
